Dir. Jean-Noel Gobron Belgium 1984 Cal 16mm 75 Mins Tokyo — a culture-shocked European in a love-affair which includes the whole, bizarre Tokyo society, as well as his landlady's daughter. Kabuki, theatre of spectacle and transvestism; the Takinokazuki, jiving on the sidewalks in huge crowds, dressed in an incongruous parody of 'fifties rock'n'roll' hordes of identical salaried-men flowing like lemmings through the crammed commuter system; red-light peepshows and the shortest Bluebell girls in the world; crowds of people, eating, playing, wedding, TV-ing, intense, indefatigable, different. Among this bewildering whirlpool of otherness, a Belgian filmmaker seeks satori, the undefinable inner peace of Zen - the art of forgetting oneself, and tries to cope with the stress of frantic, exotic Tokyo.
